The deadline for the County Clerk to receive absentee ballot applications by mail, fax, or e-mail for Preferential Primary is February 27, 2024.

The deadline for County Clerk to receive absentee ballot applications in person from the voter, designated bearer, or administrator is March 1, 2024, no later than 4:30 p.m.

Absentee ballots will be processed and canvassed beginning at 10:00 a.m. starting February 29, 2024, through March 4, 2024.

Absentee ballots will be opened, processed, and canvassed beginning at 8:30 a.m. on March 5, 2024, at the Carroll County Clerk's Office in Berryville.

Early voting and absentee votes will be counted at 7:30 p.m. on March 5, 2024, at the Carroll County Courthouse, 210 W. Church Ave., Berryville, AR 72616.

In accordance with the requirements of Ark. Code Ann. § 7-5-202(b)(2)(A), a notice of election officials will be posted as of February 11, 2024, and remain posted until March 12, 2024, at the County Clerk's Office in the Eastern and Western District Courthouses. Ark. Code Ann. § 7-5-202 *(a)(2)(B) Another person makes an objection to his or her service to the County Board of Election Commissioners within seven (7) calendar days after posting the list of officials. Grievances can be filed by submitting a written objection to the County Clerk's Office.

THE DEADLINE TO APPLY TO REGISTER TO VOTE IN THE PREFERENTIAL PRIMARY ELECTION IS FEBRUARY 5, 2024.

Deadline for county to county transfer of registered voters allowed to vote in election March 1, 2024.

PUBLIC LOGIC AND ACCURACY TESTING of the voting equipment for Early Voting and Election Day use deadline is Monday, February 12, 2024. Scheduled date to be announced in separate notice.

March 3, 2024, is the deadline to register to vote in the Preferential Primary Runoff Election on April 2, 2024 all affected polling sites will be open.

The Carroll County Board of Election Commissioners will meet on March 11, 2024, at 11:00 a.m. at the Carroll County Clerk's office for Provisional Ballot Hearing.

The Carroll County Board of Election Commissioners will meet on March 15, 2024, at 5:00 p.m. at the Carroll County Clerk's Office to certify the results of the 2024 Preferential Primary.

Berryville School District No. 27 of Carroll County 42.2 Mill School Tax

The total tax rate proposed above includes the uniform rate of tax (the "Statewide Uniform Rate") to be collected on all taxable property in the State and remitted to the State Treasurer pursuant to Amendment No. 74 to the Arkansas Constitution to be used solely for maintenance and operation of schools in the State. As provided in Amendment No. 74, the Statewide Uniform Rate replaces a portion of the existing rate of tax levied by this School District and available for maintenance and operations of schools in this District. The total proposed school tax levy of 42.2 mills includes 25.0 mills specifically voted for general maintenance and operation and 17.2 mills voted for debt service previously voted as a continuing levy pledged for the retirement of existing bonded indebtedness. The surplus revenues produced each year by debt service millage may be used by the District for other school purposes.

The total proposed school tax levy of 42.2 mills represents the same rate presently being collected.

As provided in Amendment No. 74, the Statewide Uniform Rate replaces a portion of the existing rate of tax levied by this School District and available for maintenance and operation of schools in this District. The total proposed school tax levy of 36.10 mills includes 25.0 mills specifically voted for general maintenance and operation and 11.10 mills voted for debt service previously voted as a continuing levy pledged for the retirement of existing bonded indebtedness. The surplus revenues produced each year by debt service millage may be used by the District for other school purposes.

Green Forest School Dist. No. 32 of Carroll County

36.0 Mill School Tax
